TITLE/RANK: Assistant Professor - Anatomist

DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: Applicants should have broad training in human and/or vertebrate anatomy. The successful candidate will share responsibility for teaching a human anatomy course for majors, human anatomy and physiology courses for non-majors, and advanced courses in their specialty area. Expertise in areas of interest to pre-health professional students (*e.g.*, developmental biology, histology, neurobiology, endocrinology) are desirable. The successful candidate will also be expected to participate in teaching introductory courses for biology majors and non-majors, and should exhibit potential for independent and innovative research involving Master's and undergraduate students.
