Art Education at SIUE

The art education program at SIUE, offered through the Department of Art and Design in the College of Arts and Sciences, is a K-12 teacher licensure program in visual arts education for the state of Illinois. The program is built on an understanding and application of skills in the fields of art studio, art history, and the role and function of art to general education and to the culture it serves. Our program is grounded in the School of Education knowledge base, which promotes the “Teacher as an Inquirer-Professional”. The program is based on the initial level for teacher preparation in the areas of knowledge application and development, instructional process, context and foundations of education, learners and learning, interpersonal relation skills, and professional relationships. At SIUE, our students are engaged in inquiry and reflection, which are necessary components in the development of successful learning environments in various contexts. Our students observe and interact with a wide variety of art education professionals in diverse art program settings in order to understand the role of each program to the needs of their future students and instructional objectives.

The art education program at SIUE stresses the development of the student as an artist-teacher, the student as a professional teacher and the development of the student’s teaching skills in school. Students at SIUE have access to excellent facilities and a variety of equipment for creating art. These facilities and equipment allows students to obtain hands-on experience in creating art, presenting lessons and writing curriculum. Our students are prepared for their future careers as artist-teachers with a broad, general background in intermediate-level courses in studio art, art history, art education and professional education. To complete the art education program, students participate in intensive student teaching for one semester in two school settings at K-12 public schools throughout Illinois and Missouri.

Career Opportunities

Graduates of the art education program at SIUE are prepared to successfully compete for career and graduate education opportunities. Our students pursue advanced Master of Fine Arts (MFA) and Master of Arts (MA) degrees in visual arts education and studio art, and gain employment with area public and private schools, teaching in K-12 classrooms.

Hands-On Learning

At SIUE, art education students gain valuable hands-on experience as teachers through various internship opportunities. The most prominent opportunities are the Saturday Studio Program and the Summer Arts Program, both run by the Department of Art and Design. These programs serve primary, intermediate and advanced students in grades K-12.

The close proximity of SIUE to the St. Louis metropolitan area allows the opportunity for our students to study original works of art with easy access to numerous museums and cultural institutions. St. Louis is home to the Saint Louis Art Museum (SLAM), the Pulitzer Foundation for the Arts, the Contemporary Art Museum St. Louis (CAM), the Laumeier Sculpture Park, Cahokia Mounds and many others.

Students at SIUE also have the opportunity to participate in the student chapter of the National Art Education Association. The chapter at SIUE is an active and visible organization on campus, providing networking and professional development opportunities for members. Students participate in service learning experiences where classroom learning can be applied. Chapter members have represented the art education program via local, state and national platforms, including the Illinois Art Education Association Conference and the National Art Education Association Conference.

TRANSFER STUDENTS – Transfer students should contact the department for a review of credentials and placement at least 30 days before the beginning of the term for which entry is desired. Transfer Credit Equivalency Guides are located at siue.edu/transfer.

Admission Requirements

To be admitted to the Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts programs, students must:

- Complete all Academic Development courses required by the University.
- Complete any courses required to address high school deficiencies.
- Attain a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale; Art Education and Art History majors need a GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.

To be admitted into the Teacher Licensure program, students must have:

- Received a grade of C or above in ENG 101 and 102.
- Successfully completed the introductory course CIED100 Introduction to Education with a grade of C or higher.
- Completed 43 semester hours of course credit.
- Passed the Illinois Licensure Testing System (ILTS) Test of Academic Proficiency (formerly the Basic Skills Test) or the ACT plus Writing equivalent with the approved substitute application. Information about the Test of Academic Proficiency is available at il.nesinc.com.

Graduation Requirements

- Complete all general education and specific program requirements.
- File an Application for Graduation by the first day of the term in which you plan to graduate.
- Complete Senior Assignments.
