Why Art?

Students with degrees in art go on to become painters, sculptors, printmakers, photographers, animators, and fashion and graphic designers. Graduates can choose careers as art teachers or art therapists who use visual expression to help children and adults realize their strengths and potential. A graduate can become an art director who helps a company craft its image through branding and advertising campaigns or a multimedia artist who uses a wide range of media to communicate their vision. A degree in art can lead to a career as a medical illustrator who promotes education, research and patient care by transforming complex information into visual images that can be understood by broad audiences.

Art at SIUE

Students in SIUE's Art and Design program enjoy small class sizes, intensive fundamentals training and many studio classes. Undergraduate offerings include introductory and specialized courses in drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture, ceramics, textiles, glass working, graphic design, photography/digital arts, jewelry and metals, museology, art history and professional preparation for a future as an art teacher.

A wide range of two- and three-dimensional course opportunities enhance major areas of concentration. Faculty in the Art and Design Department strive to nurture the entire artist and thereby believe in a strong, broad-based liberal arts program that provides students with knowledge beyond the arts

Career Outlook

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment of artists and related workers is expected to grow 16 percent through 2016. Competition in all art and design fields is generally healthy. The outlook is most favorable for multimedia artists and animators as the demand for special effects in movies, television and video games increases. Medical illustration also will be in demand as medical research grows. Salaries vary greatly for artists. Average earnings for artists range from \$32,570 for craft artists to \$88,510 for art directors. Being an artist is rewarding both monetarily and in terms of job satisfaction. Sixty-two percent of artists are self-employed.

How to Apply

Students in good standing wishing to apply for a major or minor may enter the program by filing a formal application for a major or minor through the office of Academic Counseling and Advising, and then consulting with one of the department undergraduate advisers.

Admission Requirements

To be admitted to the Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts program, students must:

- complete all Academic Development courses required by the University.
- complete any courses required to address high school deficiencies.
- attain a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale); Art Education and Art History majors need a 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale).
