To enter Pre-Business status, students are required to have:

1. Completed all Academic Development courses required by the University;
2. Completed any required courses to address high school deficiencies;
3. A cumulative grade point average of 2.25;
4. Completed ENG 101, ENG 102, SPC 105, PHIL 106 or PHIL 207 or MATH 106, and CMIS 108 with a grade of C or higher in each course.

Declaration:

Declaration into this major requires admission to the School of Business and at least a 2.5 cumulative grade point average. Admission to the School of Business is by application only.

Retention and Graduation:

To be retained in the Accountancy program, students must maintain a 2.5 cumulative GPA. Students who do not meet this requirement for two consecutive semesters will be removed from the program.

To enroll in 300- and 400-level Accounting courses beyond ACCT 301, 311, and 340, students must be declared into the accountancy program. To enroll in ACCT 303, 401 and 431, students must be in good standing in the Accountancy program. Good standing in the Accountancy program is defined as a declared Accountancy major that has at least a 2.5 cumulative GPA and at least a 2.5 accounting GPA.

To graduate from the Accountancy program, students must have at least a 2.5 cumulative GPA, at least a 2.5 accounting GPA, and at least a 2.25 business GPA.

Requirements to Apply for Admission to the School of Business:

1. Admitted to SIUE.
2. All official transcripts from all community colleges and other four-year institutions must be received by the Service Center at: SIUE Service Center, Registrar's Office, Box 1080, Edwardsville, IL 62026-1080
3. Minimum GPA necessary for full consideration is 2.25 on a 4.0 scale (in prerequisite courses and cumulative GPA). Please note that the grade point averages of applicants admitted to the School of Business are generally well above this minimum.
4. For summer applicants, students must pass **all of the following 9 prerequisite courses** with a grade of "C" or better by the end of the preceding spring semester.
5. For fall applicants, students must pass **all of the following 9 prerequisite courses** with a grade of "C" or better by the end of the preceding summer term.
6. For spring applicants, students must pass **all of the following 9 prerequisite courses** with a grade of "C" or better by the end of the preceding fall semester.
7. The prerequisite courses are: ENG 101, ENG 102, SPC 105, CMIS 108, ECON 111, ECON 112, MATH 120, MS 250, and ACCT 200.
8. Submission of a fully completed Application for Undergraduate Admission received by the School of Business Student Services Office by the appropriate deadline. Applications are available online at www.siu.edu/business or in Founders Hall 3301.
 - a. The application deadline for **SUMMER or FALL** admission is **March 1**.
 - b. The application deadline for **SPRING** admission is **October 1**.
 - c. Applicants will be notified of their status within approximately 45 days of the application deadline.

Admission decisions will be based primarily on the student's performance in collegiate-level work and a required essay. Other factors that may be considered in the admission decisions include, but are not limited to, courses taken, pattern and trend of grades, institutions attended, co-curricular activities, as well as career or work-related experience. The School of Business intends to admit students who demonstrate the greatest likelihood of academic success while also ensuring the diversity of the student body.

Admission to the School of Business is competitive, and not all students who apply to the School of Business will be admitted. The number of students admitted depends on the capacity of the School.

Students who are not fully admitted to a program will not be allowed to enroll in 300- and 400-level business courses.

All students who are accepted into the School of Business are **required** to attend an orientation session. Students who are admitted will attend an orientation session in the preceding semester. Students will not be allowed to register for 300-level business courses until they have attended an orientation session. Students who do not attend an orientation session will have the offer of admission rescinded and will not be allowed to register for any 300- or 400-level business courses.
