Note: Students must either select a minor in another department or choose a concentration within anthropology. A concentration will consist of 18 credit hours in one or more fields related to one of the four subfields of anthropology (biological anthropology, cultural anthropology, linguistic anthropology, and archaeology). The courses will be selected by the student in consultation with an anthropology advisor and must be approved by the Anthropology Chair.

FIELD SCHOOL: The Bachelor of Science degree requires 9 hours of field school credit. The Department offers three field schools, one in archaeology (ANTH 375 and ANTH 475), one in biological anthropology (ANTH 374 and ANTH 474), and one in ethnography (ANTH 373 and ANTH 473). Field schools are taught during the summer, and typically only one field school is offered each summer. Students simultaneously register for the introductory and the advanced hours if they want to take all 9 hours in one field school area. Since the introductory courses (373, 374, and 375) carry sliding credit, it is also possible for a student in two consecutive summers to take the introductory courses in two areas and the advanced in only one to complete the required 9 hours.

Declaring an Anthropology Major: To declare a major in Anthropology, it is necessary to have:

1. Completed all Academic Development courses required by the University;
2. Completed any required courses to address high school deficiencies;
3. A cumulative grade average of at least 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale).
