+ Students should choose SPC 103, an Introductory Social Sciences, Distribution Fine Arts & Humanities, Distribution Social Sciences, or Interdisciplinary Studies course that also meets the Intergroup Relations requirements. If not, an additional course from the list of IGR courses in the current SIUE Undergraduate Catalog must also be taken.

It is strongly recommended that students complete 9 hours from one studio area and 6 hours in other areas. Please consult with an Art Education faculty mentor.

^ A contemporary art history course and a non-western art history course are strongly recommended.

* ART 202f Weaving/Textiles, ART 202i Graphic Design, or ART 202h Photography is recommended. ART 202f Weaving/Textiles and ART 202g Metalsmithing are required to also be certified in the state of Missouri.

Students may elect to take courses during the summer term to lessen the academic load.

Students may elect to take one year of foreign language to obtain a Bachelor of Arts.

Note: Students seeking education certification must have grades of C or higher in all general education, major content, and professional education courses. Grades of D are not accepted by the Illinois State Board of Education for certification purposes.

Declaring an Art Education Major: In order to declare a major in Art Education, it is necessary to have:

1. Completed all Academic Development courses required by the University;
2. Completed any required courses to address high school deficiencies; and
3. A cumulative grade point average of 2.5.

In order to be admitted into the teacher certification program, students must have:

1. Received a grade of C or above in ENG 101 and ENG 102;
2. Successfully completed the introductory course CI 200.
3. Completed 43 semester hours of course credit and have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher (this includes work at other institutions); and
4. Passed all areas of the ICTS Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP), formerly Basic Skills Test, within 5 attempts. Information about the test is available online at www.icts.nesinc.com.
