Of the 36 hours in English major courses, at least 15 must be at the 400 level, and no more than 15 may be at the 200 level. ENG 499 may not count toward 400-level course requirements. Only courses in which the student receives a C or better will be accepted for credit toward the English major.

Note: One year of Foreign Language required. Students planning to attend graduate school in English or law school should take two years of a foreign language and should choose ENG 301, Basic Literary Criticism, or ENG 495, History of Literary Criticism, as one of their English electives.

Declaration of Major: To declare a major in English, it is necessary to have:

1. Completed all Academic Development courses required by the University;
2. Completed any required courses to address high school deficiencies;
3. A cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale).

Department of English Requirements for the Major

- ◆ **Surveys** -- 9 hours required. Students may choose from the following courses: ENG 208, 209, 211, 212, 214, or 215.
- ◆ **Major Authors** -- 6 hours required. Students may choose from the following courses: ENG 307, 404, 471a, 471b, 473, 477, 479, or 480.
- ◆ **Literary Theory** -- 3 hours required. Students may choose from ENG 301 or 495.
- ◆ **Language Systems** -- 3 hours required. Students may choose from ENG 369, 400, 403, or 416.
- ◆ **Writing Approaches** -- 3 hours required. Students may choose from ENG 290, 490, or 491.
- ◆ **Electives in English** -- 6 hours required. Any English course number 200 or higher.
