If students have one or more years of German in high school, they should contact the Department of Foreign Languages to take proficiency tests for appropriate lower-level course work such as GER 101, 102, 201, and 202. GER 101 and 102 do not count toward major requirements, but may be counted as General Education Option B requirements.

Options for a double major, double minor or a single minor are available to German majors. At least one minor is highly recommended and a double major is strongly encouraged. Students considering a double major should decide on a second major as soon as possible.

Declaring a German Major: To declare a major in German, it is necessary to have:

1. Completed all Academic Development courses required by the University;
2. Completed any required courses to address high school deficiencies;
3. A cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale).

Entering freshmen may apply upon entry if they have no Academic Development courses required.
