+ FL 111c Introduction to Foreign Languages: Spanish cannot count as an Introductory Fine Arts & Humanities for Spanish majors.

If students have one or more years of Spanish in high school, they should contact the Department of Foreign Languages to take proficiency tests for appropriate lower-level course work such as SPAN 101, 102, 201, and 202. SPAN 101 and 102 do not count toward major requirements, but may be counted as General Education Option B requirements.

Options for a double major, double minor, or a single minor are available to Spanish majors. At least one minor is highly recommended and a double major is strongly encouraged. Students considering a double major should decide on a second major as soon as possible.

Declaring a Spanish Major: To declare a major in Spanish, it is necessary to have:

1. Completed all Academic Development courses required by the University;
2. Completed any required courses to address high school deficiencies;
3. A cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale).

Entering freshmen may apply upon entry if they have no Academic Development courses required.
