- # It is preferable to complete CI 440 *prior* to student teaching; however, if necessary, it is possible to take CI 440 during the semester in which student teaching is done.

Area of Specialization (AOS): Geography majors completing an AOS in Teacher Certification will receive Type 9 High School Certification in Social Science. All courses taken as part of an AOS require a minimum grade of C.

Choice of one POLS course: POLS 300, Political Analysis; POLS 340, American Presidency; POLS 342, Issues in American Public Policy; or POLS 370, International Relations.

Upon completion of the prerequisite GEOG 205, geography majors must complete **two human geography courses** selected from any of the following: GEOG 300, 301*, 400, 401, 402, 406, or 450 (human geography topic).

Upon completion of the prerequisite GEOG 210, geography majors must complete **one physical geography course** selected from among the following: GEOG 310, 312, 314, 315, 316, 410, 411, 412, 413, or 450 (physical geography topic). Note: It is recommended that GEOG 440 be substituted in place of one of the 300/400 level physical geography courses.

Upon completion of the prerequisite GEOG 201, geography majors must complete **one regional geography course** selected from among the following: GEOG 330, 331, 332, 333, 334, or 450 (regional topic).

Upon completion of the prerequisite GEOG 320, geography majors must complete **one geography techniques course** selected from among the following: GEOG 322, 418, 422, 423, 424, 425, or 450 (techniques topic).

Declaring a Geography Major: To declare a major in Geography, it is necessary to have:

1. Completed all Academic Development courses required by the University;
2. Completed any required courses to address high school deficiencies;
3. A cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale).

To be accepted into the teacher certification program, students must:

1. Have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher;
2. Complete CI 200 with a grade of C or better;
3. Pass the ICTS Basic Skills Test. Information about this test is available online at www.icts.nesinc.com;
4. Maintain a B average in Geography courses.
