If not, an additional course from the list of II/IC courses in the current SIUE Undergraduate Catalog must also be taken.
- # In order to satisfy the Intergroup Relations (IGR) requirement, SPC 103 or IS 350, 352, or 375 must be included. If not, an additional course from the list of IGR courses in the current SIUE Undergraduate Catalog must also be taken.

Declaring a Music Education Major: To declare a major in Music Education, it is necessary to have:

1. Completed all Academic Development courses required by the University;
2. Completed any required courses to address high school deficiencies;
3. A cumulative grade point average of 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale);
4. A letter of authorization from the Music Department.

In order to be admitted into the teacher certification program, students must:

1. Receive a grade of C or above in ENG 101 and ENG 102;
2. Complete 43 semester hours of course credit and have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher (this includes work at other institutions and in skills courses);
3. Successfully complete the introductory course CI 200;
4. Pass the ICTS Basic Skills Test. Information about this test is available at: www.icts.nesinc.com.
