While an art minor is not required, it is highly recommended that students wishing to specialize in Design/Technical Theater pursue a strong foundation in art courses, including two-dimension and three-dimension communication.

Note: This guide provides only a suggested course of study. The guide should be used in consultation with an adviser and the SIUE Undergraduate Catalog.

Declaring a Design/Technical Theater Major: In order to declare a major in Design/Technical Theater, it is necessary to have:

1. Completed all Academic Development courses required by the University;
2. Completed any required courses to address high school deficiencies;
3. Been admitted in good standing or have a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale).
