If you do not enroll in the semester for which you applied but wish to enroll in a later term, you may need to submit a new application. Additional documentation is due by the deadline for the semester in which you plan to enter. Please refer to the online undergraduate catalog at www.siue.edu/registrar, or contact an admission counselor for academic eligibility requirements.

Application Fee:

A **non-refundable** application fee of \$30 must accompany this application. Payment should be made in U.S. dollars by check or money order payable to SIUE. **To pay by credit card, you are encouraged to apply online.** Applications received without the fee will not be processed. Applicants who change their term of entry may update their file by submitting a new application for the next two terms without another application fee. Undergraduate students currently enrolled at SIUE are not assessed an additional fee to apply for a change in degree status. Requests for a fee waiver are available online at www.siue.edu/apply and should be sent to the Director of Admissions.

Other College or University Credit

Students who have earned college credit from other regionally accredited institutions must have official transcripts sent from the granting institution directly to:

Faxed documents are considered unofficial. Please note, any college credits obtained while attending high school also must be reported on an official transcript from the college or university at which credit was earned. Intentional nondisclosure of transfer credit may result in dismissal from the University.

When will I be notified of acceptance?

Your application will be reviewed within 2-4 weeks after we have received all required documents.

Degree-seeking Applicants

If you plan to pursue an undergraduate degree, you should apply for degree-seeking status (see question 16). This is required to make you eligible for most financial aid and veterans' education benefits. The documents required are listed by applicant category. To be considered official, your documents must be mailed directly to the Office of Admissions by the institution that issues them.

Freshman Applicants

This category includes high school seniors, anyone who has graduated from high school, or anyone who has completed the General Educational Development (G.E.D.) examination and who has not subsequently attempted college work.

- A. If you're a high school senior or have graduated from high school within the last five years,** submit an official high school transcript and ACT/SAT scores to SIUE. The transcript for high school seniors must show 6th, 7th or 8th semester class rank. A final high school transcript verifying graduation must be submitted as soon as it is available. The transcript for applicants who have graduated from high school must verify graduation and display final semester rank. ACT/SAT scores that appear on your high school transcript are accepted.
- B. If you graduated from high school five or more years ago,** you must have an official high school transcript sent to us, verifying your graduation and showing your final semester class rank. ACT/SAT scores are optional for this category. If you've taken the ACT/SAT test, you are encouraged to submit the scores to SIUE.
- C. If you've passed the G.E.D. examination,** ask the County Superintendent of Schools to send an official copy of your G.E.D. scores to SIUE. Also submit an official copy of your high school transcript if your high school class graduated within the past five years. ACT/SAT scores are not required. However, if you have taken the ACT/SAT test, we encourage you to have the scores sent to us.

Transfer Applicants

This category includes anyone who has attempted college work since high school graduation, and has not previously attended SIUE.

- A. If you've completed 30 or more semester hours** of transfer-level credit, you should ask each college you attended to send an official transcript to the SIUE Office of Admissions.
- B. If you've completed fewer than 30 semester hours** of transfer-level credit, you should send the credentials described in the Freshman Applicant category as well as official college transcripts to SIUE.

Returning Applicants

This includes anyone who has previously attended SIUE but has not attended the University within the last 12 months.

Visiting Student Applicants

This category includes anyone who has at least a high school diploma or equivalent and wishes to enroll in undergraduate courses for credit, but is not interested in pursuing a baccalaureate degree at SIUE.

The only document required is the completed application. However, you may be required to present evidence of prerequisite completion at the time of registration.

Visiting students are not eligible to receive financial aid. However, if a visiting student is currently pursuing a degree at another post-secondary institution, the student may be eligible for VA benefits or student employment. Students wishing to apply for student employment or receive VA benefits need to submit appropriate documentation confirming their degree-seeking status at a parent institution.

Students in visiting status may not accumulate more than 30 semester hours at the University. If a student has accumulated 30 semester hours of credit and wishes to continue enrollment at SIUE, he/she must apply to the University as a degree-seeking student and satisfy appropriate criteria. Continued enrollment will not be permitted until the student satisfies admission criteria or appeals to the Director of Admissions.

Applicants previously denied admission in degree-seeking categories are not admissible as visiting students.

Applicants still in high school may be considered by the Director of Admissions for admission as visiting students.

International Students

Scholarships Available at SIUE

Meridian Scholarships

Award Amount: Full tuition room and board scholarships awarded annually as funding is available.

Criteria: Through a competitive process, admitted freshmen with an ACT ≥ 27 will be considered. All students are encouraged to apply.

Application Deadline: 12/1/2008, including application for admission along with Meridian Supplemental Profile.

Award Renewal: Award is good for eight semesters. Students must complete 12 hours per semester and maintain a 3.25 cumulative GPA.

Cougar Pride Scholarships

Award Amount: Up to \$8,000 over four years awarded for freshman and/or transfers as funding is available.

Criteria: Through a competitive process, admitted freshmen with an ACT ≥ 27 will be considered. Transfers must have a minimum 3.0 GPA in coursework that is transferable to SIUE. Students transferring from a 2 year, regionally accredited institution must have earned a minimum of 24 semester hours in coursework that is transferable to SIUE. This award may also be granted to those students coming from a 2 year institution with a recognized associate degree. All students are encouraged to apply.

Application Deadline: Preferential consideration will be given to students completing the application for admission on or before 12/1/08. FAFSA completion is required.

Award Renewal: Award is good for eight semesters. Students must complete 12 hours per semester and maintain a 2.9 cumulative GPA.

Johnetta Haley Scholarship

Award Amount: Up to \$8,000 over four years awarded for freshmen and/or transfers as funding is available.

Criteria: Through a competitive process, admitted freshmen with an ACT ≥ 23 will be considered. Transfers must have a minimum 3.0 GPA in coursework that is transferable to SIUE. Students transferring from a 2 year, regionally accredited institution must have earned a minimum of 24 semester hours in coursework that is transferable to SIUE. This award may also be granted to those students coming from a 2 year institution with a recognized associate degree. This program is designed to encourage enrollment of new freshmen and transfer students from underrepresented backgrounds planning on careers in nursing, engineering, sciences or teacher education. All students are encouraged to apply.

Application Deadline: Preferential consideration will be given to students completing the application for admission on or before 12/1/08. FAFSA completion is required.

Award Renewal: Award is good for eight semesters. Students must complete 12 hours per semester and maintain a 2.9 cumulative GPA.

The "e" Guarantee

Award Amount: Amounts will vary. After completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), and applying all available State and Federal programs to a student's account, SIUE will assist families with filling remaining unmet financial need. Awards will be made as funding is available.

Criteria: Admitted Illinois freshmen with an ACT ≥ 19 , \$0 Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and family income levels at or below federal poverty guidelines.

Application Deadline: Preferential consideration will be given to students completing the application for admission on or before 12/1/08 and the FAFSA by 3/1/09.

Award Renewal: Student's financial eligibility for the program will be reviewed annually. Award is good for up to eight semesters. Students must complete 12 hours per semester and maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA.

Other Scholarship Opportunities

Elite Scholarship

(admission application serves as application)

For students who live outside Illinois, this scholarship covers the cost differential between in-state and out-of-state tuition for one year. The scholarship may be used during the fall and spring semesters of your first year of undergraduate study. Eligibility and number of scholarships vary.

Phi Theta Kappa Transfer Scholarships

(separate application required)

The Phi Theta Kappa Transfer Scholarship is available for new transfer students who are members of PTK and have earned an associate's degree from an Illinois Community College.

University/Foundation Scholarships

(separate application required)

A variety of scholarships are made possible by gracious gifts from alumni, staff and community supporters.
