This presentation will provide the audience with an overview of psychotropic medications used for the treatment of schizophrenia, bipolar disorders, depression and anxiety. Medication mechanisms of action, common and rare adverse effects, and clinical application of these medications will be discussed. Other topics to be covered will include: medication adherence in the mentally ill as well as new and innovative treatment options for psychiatric disorders.

Dr. Gable is a graduate of the University of Mississippi, School of Pharmacy, and subsequently completed a specialty residency in Psychiatric Pharmacy Practice at the University of Southern California. She is a Board Certified Psychiatric Pharmacist. She currently holds joint appointments with the Saint Louis University School of Medicine, Department of Neurology and Psychiatry, as well as with the Missouri Department of Mental Health. Her clinical appointment is with Community Alternatives in St. Louis Missouri, where she works collaboratively with psychiatry in the treatment of persons with persistent mental illnesses.

Electronic Aggression and the Victimization of Children

This presentation will provide information on how predators lure children into becoming victims, and what can be done to stop this from happening. Going beyond what has been seen on 'Dateline', Detective Bazzell, will also cover MySpace, FaceBook, Cyber Bullying, Chat Rooms, and other communication forms used by predators. Some of the session will be conducted live on the Internet with real examples of the procedures discussed.

SPEAKER: Mike Bazzell, Computer Crime Detective, is part of the Administration Division of the Alton Police Department. He handles all cases involving any type of Computer Crime and Computer Forensic Analysis, including State and Federal cases throughout the St. Louis area.

Upon completion of a degree in criminal justice he was selected as the Director of the Regional Computer Crime Enforcement Group (RCCEG "Ar-seg"), a group initiated by the Illinois Attorney General's Office to train local and state law enforcement officers in how to handle high-tech crimes. He is also a computer crime instructor for the Southern Illinois Law Enforcement Commission (SILEC) and currently teaches Computer Forensics and Investigations at Lewis & Clark College.
