INTRODUCTION

The Southern Illinois University Edwardsville School of Business extends appreciation to sponsors of School of Business scholarships and awards. Please state in the application what year you will be (freshman, sophomore, junior, senior, graduate student) during academic year 2009/2010.

These scholarships and awards will be presented at the Scholarships and Awards Luncheon Tuesday, April 7, 2009, from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

Depending on sponsorship, not all awards will be available in a given year. Award amounts may be adjusted based on funding.
