Goals:

1. Increase didactic exposure to pain and palliative care during PharmD training
2. Increase experiential rotation exposure during to pain and palliative care during introductory and advanced patient care experientials during PharmD training

Objectives:

1. Review and recommend standards and recommended assessment methods via AACP and ACPE
2. Discourse with NABP regarding appropriate quantity, depth, and breadth of NAPLEX exam questions
3. Review and potentially revise IASP curricular recommendations for schools / colleges of pharmacy

Goals:

1. Improve / increase exposure to pain and palliative care in PGY1 residencies
2. Improve consistency among PGY2 specialty residencies (Geriatrics, Heme-Onc, Pain, Palliative Care, Community clinical)

Objectives:

1. Develop core standards PGY1 and overlapping PGY2 residencies. Review ASHP PGY 2 pain and palliative care specialty residency standards. Address standards for pain and pall care fellowships.

Goals:

1. Improve the skills, attitudes , and knowledge base of practicing licensed pharmacists regarding pain and palliative care in all practice settings
2. Reach consensus on pain and palliative care credentialing for pharmacists with therapeutic expertise

Objectives:

1. Identify core content for pain and pall care program (i.e. EPEC / ELNEC) across practice settings. Develop content for "train the trainer" educational programming
2. Identify content for individual practice settings for pain / pall care edu program
3. Address expertise recognition / credentialing
