10 Important Questions to Ask Your College Student

1. Are you attending class on a regular basis?

Poor attendance can quickly lead to poor performance, increased stress and anxiety, lower GPA's, dropping courses, and even dropping out of school.

2. How many hours outside of class do you spend studying?

Two hours of study time per hour of in-class time is recommended for students to thrive in a course.

3. Are you reviewing material on a regular basis?

"Cramming" before a test typically leads to confusion and the inability to fully learn the material. It is much more effective to regularly study in blocks of time to allow oneself to comprehend the material.

4. Are you scheduling time to relax?

Time-management is a must in college and students should allow themselves time to relax and socialize outside of studying.

5. Are you utilizing available tutoring?

Free, walk-in tutoring is available to students in most subjects. Interested students should view tutoring schedules through the Instructional Services website or through their academic department for more informaion.

6. Are you registered for Spring classes?

Now is the time for students to meet with their advisors to discuss courses for Spring 2013. Highly encourage your student to do so if they have not already.

7. Do you visit your professor's office hours?

Building a good relationship with your professor is extremely beneficial and can greatly lead to future success in the course as well as networking in the future.

8. Have you formed study groups with your peers?

Forming study groups with those in one's courses allows one to meet other students interested in the same field and adds resources to course success.

9. Have you joined an organization or gotten involved on campus?

Participating in the many student clubs and organizations offered on campus can help your student to feel more unified in the SIUE community and can lead to a larger social network.

10. Are your tuition dates paid on time?

The first installment for Spring courses (as well as any remaining balance from the Fall semester) must be paid by Dec. 7, 2012.

Spring 2013 Registration

Check with your student(s) to make sure they are aware and are registered by the following dates.

- October 15, 2012: Priority web registration begins for undergraduate students who have completed 90 or more earned hours and all graduate students.
- October 22, 2012: Web registration begins for undergraduate students who have completed 60 or more earned hours.
- October 29, 2012: Web registration begins for undergraduate students who have completed 30 or more earned hours.
- **November 5, 2012:** Web registration open for all remaining undergraduate students are visiting students.
- December 7, 2012: First Spring Installment payment due (the registrations of students who have not paid the first installment and any prior term balance will be cancelled from classes).
- **January 4, 2013:** Last day to add a class via CougarNet.



Registration dates for Spring of 2013 are located on the Registrar's website.



Things to Note:

- SIUE grades do not get mailed out. You should speak with your student(s) about monitoring their own grades on Blackboard and, if agreed between each of you, gaining third-party access to their CougarNet account. This will allow you to track their progress to graduation as well as monitoring their course grades. For more information, visit CougarNet.
- If your student's GPA slips below a **2.00**, they will be placed on academic probation. For more information on academic probation, please see information regarding policies at SIUE.
