SIUE has a significant number of first-time, full-time Freshmen who move to the School of Pharmacy and earn a Pharm.D. degree without earning a baccalaureate degree. These students are not reported in our official baccalaureate graduation rates but are captured in the table below. This table supplements and enhances the data in our Student-Right-to-Know persistence tables by including both Undergraduate and Pharmacy retention and graduation. Columns comparing Undergraduate-only graduation and retention rates starting at Year 6 (150%) are included.
