CAMPUS SECURITY POLICIES & CRIME STATISTICS

- **GENERAL STATEMENT**

Southern Illinois University Edwardsville is committed to providing a safe and secure environment for its students, employees, and visitors, and to enforce fully all state and federal laws and institutional policies and regulations to help ensure such an environment. This commitment is reflected in SIU Edwardsville’s Statement of University Values: *“A humane, safe, and supportive environment is essential to the welfare, growth, and advancement of all members of a university community.”*

All members of the University are required to abide by applicable state and federal laws and University policies and regulations. Board of Trustees policy (2 Policies of the Board C-2) explicitly states this requirement for all employees. SIU Edwardsville’s policy, the Student Conduct Code, explicitly states this requirement for students. Visitors to the University also are required to comply with the law and University policies. Compliance with all applicable laws is required, including those regarding:

- 1) the possession, use sale, or delivery of alcoholic beverages to underage persons; and
- 2) the possession, use manufacture, delivery, or sale of illegal drugs and controlled substances.

- **LEGAL AUTHORITY FOR ENFORCEMENT**

Pursuant to Illinois law (110 ILCS 520/8.10), the University is authorized to employ persons as members of its police department in order to provide for the protection of University property and interests, University students and personnel, and otherwise. University Police officers have all powers possessed by police in cities, and sheriffs, except that they are not empowered to serve and execute civil processes.

University Police at Southern Illinois University Edwardsville is a law enforcement agency responsible for the protection of life and property. Officers are sworn police personnel under the authority granted by Illinois law and have the power to make arrests. Law enforcement services are provided to the Edwardsville campus, the School of Dental Medicine in Alton, and the East St. Louis Higher Education Campus. University Police provide services 24 hours per day, 365 days per year.

Emergency 911 calls are directed to University Police, which is responsible for dispatching appropriate police, fire or ambulance services. Other services provided include assistance in jump starting vehicles, retrieving keys from locked vehicles and loaning tools to engrave items for prevention of theft. Upon request, and subject to immediate availability of University Police, an escort service is provided to accompany members of the University community from one campus location to another.

Through mutual assistance agreements, the University Police Department cooperates with, provides assistance to, and receives assistance from Illinois State Police and county and municipal police departments. Similar cooperation and assistance also occur with federal law enforcement agencies.

- **DAILY OPEN / CRIME LOG**

The University Police maintain a daily log which depicts all crimes reported to the department, except when disclosure of such information is prohibited by law or such disclosure would jeopardize the confidentiality of the victim (i.e., information may be temporarily withheld if release of such information would: (a) jeopardize an ongoing criminal investigation or the safety of an individual; (b) cause a suspect to flee or evade detection; or (c) result in the destruction of evidence). Standard notations on the log include the nature, date, time and general location of each crime, and the disposition of the complaint, if known. Logs are available for review at the University Police Department. For more information about the Log, or the legal requirements pertaining to same, contact the University Police Records Unit, Monday through Friday, between 8:00 am - 4:30 pm at 618-650-3324.

- **SEX CRIMES PREVENTION ACT OF 2002**

Adult criminal sex offenders who must register with law enforcement officials must notify those officials of their enrollment or employment at institutions of Higher education within the state. That information should then be forwarded to campus police of the school or institution of higher education where the adult criminal sex offender is employed, carries on a vocation, or is a student. In accordance with the Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act of 2002, the University must notify the SIUE community of where this information can be obtained. - **ACCESS TO AND SECURITY OF FACILITIES**

University facilities exist to support the institution's principal functions of teaching, research, and service. In addition to classrooms, laboratories, and offices, the University has housing, food service, recreation and athletics, child-care, administrative support, maintenance and utility facilities.

As a public institution, the University generally seeks to maintain open access to its facilities, but it maintains and regularly exercises the right to restrict access to facilities. For example, access to laboratory, service, maintenance and utility facilities is restricted for safety and operational reasons, and access to student housing facilities is limited to residents and invited guests. In instances where a person, through his/her prior action, has demonstrated an inability or unwillingness to conduct him or herself in accord with University policy or applicable law, that person can be declared "persona non grata" and denied access to all University facilities.

The University acts to maintain secure and safe facilities for use by its students, employees, and visitors through the work of University Police, through its internal key and lock system and policies that control it, through the regular work of University maintenance and custodial personnel, through the assigned responsibilities of personnel in University Housing, by providing adequate interior and exterior lighting, and by fostering an awareness among members of the University community about safety and security matters and the need for timely reporting to the proper authorities of criminal or suspicious activities.

- **REPORTING OF CRIME AND UNIVERSITY RESPONSE**

To help provide a secure and safe environment, all members of the University community and visitors are expected, requested, and encouraged to report any criminal activity or emergency that they observe. Reporting may be accomplished by contacting the University Police directly, or requesting assistance from a University office in contacting University Police to report a crime or emergency. **911 service** for soliciting emergency police, fire and ambulance response is provided for all University telephones to assist in reporting crimes or emergencies. The University Police office is open continuously should someone choose to submit a report in person. University Police are located in the Supporting Services Building, and are open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. A satellite station is located in Building C within the Higher Education Campus in East St. Louis. This office is also maintained 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

University Police will respond as quickly as possible to every report of a crime or emergency. Response time may be affected by the number and location of available personnel and involvement, at the time a report is received, with other incidents which must be judged by the police officer in command at the time to be of greater

or lesser importance. Action on a report may also involve response by personnel: from **University Health Service** or external ambulance or emergency services in the case of an incident possibly requiring medical treatment; from **Counseling Services** in the case of an incident possibly involving sexual assault; from the **Office of Cultural and Social Diversity** in the case of an incident possibly involving hate crimes or sexual harassment; from the **Office of the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs** in the case of an incident involving a student; from the **Office of Human Resources** in the case of an incident involving an employee; or from outside police or other agencies in the case of an incident possibly requiring manpower or specialized abilities beyond the capabilities of University Police.

- **SECURITY ALERTS & TIMELY WARNINGS TO THE CAMPUS COMMUNITY**

Every business day, the University Police sends a news release (Media Log) to University News Services for the purpose of briefing the community about crime, arrests, and police services which occurred within the previous 24 hour period. The media log is also made available daily for viewing on the Police web site and can be accessed by going to <http://www.siu.edu/POLICE/stats.html>. Through campus effort and the local media, the University strives to have an informed public.

If time and circumstances permit, notification about serious incidents, which may involve imminent danger, such as a threat to life or property, or any other type of incident which poses a serious degree of concern, is disseminated to the campus community in the form of a bulletin. Security Alert Bulletins are issued under the authority of the Vice Chancellor for Administration, and are usually distributed campus-wide. They may be stylized as individual (hard copy) flyers and/or electronic mail. (Bulletins are also available on-line at the SIUE Annual Security Report Web Site: <http://admin.siu.edu/studentrightto> or at <http://www.siu.edu/POLICE/alerts.htm>.)

- **SEXUAL ASSAULTS**

In the event of a sexual assault, victims are strongly encouraged to contact the University Police as soon as possible and report the incident. The preservation of evidence at the scene and on the victim, is crucial in a sexual assault incident. Therefore, a victim of sexual assault SHOULD NOT shower or douche; SHOULD NOT change clothes; SHOULD NOT touch anything the suspect may have touched; and for safety reasons, SHOULD NOT chase the suspect. Victims should try to remain calm and begin making mental notes of the incident. Even if a victim of sexual assault does not want to pursue criminal charges against the offender immediately, it is important that evidence is collected and preserved, should the victim wish to do so later.

Should the victim not wish to contact University Police, she/he may report the incident to the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs or Counseling Services.

- **University Police Response**

Service to the victim is of utmost priority. All officers are specially trained to handle sensitive crimes such as sexual assault investigations. Female officers are available at the request of the victim. In addition to apprehension of the offender, priority is given to providing medical care and counseling for the victim. Advocates are available from Counseling Services to assist the victim at any time during this process. Therefore, at the victim's request or upon consent, police will summon an advocate for the victim. Police will take the victim to the hospital and/or the victim may be accompanied by a relative or close friend. Trained medical personnel conduct a physical exam, with the victim's permission, using the Illinois State Police Sexual Assault Evidence Collection Kit. Police officers do not collect evidence of a personal nature from a victim's body. Follow-up medical care may be provided by University Health Services.

University Police accept reports of sexual assault from third parties and from victims who choose not to pursue criminal action. Every effort is made to protect the victim's identity.

- **Student Affairs Response**

Student Affairs response procedures include informing students of their option to notify law enforcement authorities. Personnel encourage such notification and offer to assist. Other services provided include a referral to Counseling Services and Health Services; movement to another living area and a change in class enrollment, if necessary.

Victims may file a formal complaint against another student by contacting the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs, Rendleman Hall, Room 2306, 650-2020. See "On-Campus Disciplinary Action" elsewhere in this report.

- **COUNSELING FOR VICTIMS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT**

The Counseling Services' Sexual Assault Program, provides individual counseling, and legal and medical advocacy to students and employees who have been sexually assaulted.

Victims in need of information and emotional support for issues of sexual harassment, molestation, date/acquaintance rape, and sexual assault may seek **confidential** help at the Counseling Services office. Counseling Services is located at the intersection of Cougar Village Road and North University Drive (4-corners). Office hours are Monday-Friday, 8:00 am - 4:30 PM, phone 650-2197. After hours or weekend services may be obtained by calling University Police, 650-3324, and requesting a call-back from a counselor.

An additional counseling and advocacy resource for victims is **Call For Help**, 9400 Lebanon Road, Edgemont, IL 618-397-0975 (24-hour hotline number) and **Chestnut Health Systems**, 50 Northgate Industrial Drive, Granite City, IL 618-877-4420.

- **ON-CAMPUS DISCIPLINARY ACTION**

University policy, evidenced through its' Student Conduct Code, specifies that acts of social misconduct should be reported to appropriate University officials or civil authorities. Criminal acts of social misconduct such as sexual assault, physical abuse, direct threat of violence, harassment, intimidation or behavior representing a danger to others, shall be reported to the University Police.

In addition to criminal action taken by civil authorities on behalf of the victim, the University may impose the following sanctions upon the offender: Disciplinary reprimand/warning; Assessment of restitution; Restricted access; Disciplinary probation; Restricted course enrollment; Separation for a definite/indefinite period of time; Permanent separation (Dismissal); University residence probation/transfer; Separation from a University residence.

- **OFF-CAMPUS ACTIVITIES OF STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS**

SIUE's Student Conduct Code applies to student conduct both on and off campus, including conduct at events and meetings sponsored by University-recognized organizations, and in off-campus fraternity or sorority housing. The policy provides that a student organization or its officers may be held responsible for conduct by persons associated with the organization when the conduct received the tacit or overt approval or encouragement of the organization or its representatives. Conduct violating the standards established in the policy may result in University disciplinary action against the organization or individual(s) in addition to any action that may be brought by civil authorities for violation of local or state law or ordinances.

Through interagency cooperation with municipal police departments, the University seeks to be kept apprised of off-campus criminal activity involving students, student organizations, or off-campus fraternity or sorority housing so that the University may take appropriate action.

- **SECURITY AWARENESS AND CRIME PREVENTION PROGRAMS**

SIUE is strongly committed to crime prevention, law enforcement and crime reporting. University campuses, like all other communities however, are not immune to crime. Students, faculty and staff are urged to take advantage of safety programs, to take all reasonable precautions for their own safety and to report all crimes.

***The SIUE Alcohol and Drug Awareness Program** provides students with multi-level prevention approaches through programs and services which empower them, individually and collectively, to support an environment of responsible and knowledgeable choices. National Collegiate Alcohol Awareness Week (NCAAW) has become the foundation for this philosophy and year-long programming. NCAAW programs like Tons of Fun, designated driver programs, information tables, and interactive plays have helped increase the awareness of the SIUE Alcohol and Drug Awareness Program and its philosophy. Class presentations, Alcohol 101, an educational program for disciplinary intervention, Red Ribbon Day and other theme events have established year-long program efforts.

The SIUE Alcohol and Drug Awareness Program has developed peer education programs, curriculum module components, social norms and a media campaign. Co-sponsorships with student organizations and support for major campus-wide events such as Welcome Week and Homecoming have become integral parts of awareness efforts. A well developed resource library and referral services to community agencies can be of additional assistance to students.

Coordination of efforts with campus departments is also very effective. Collaboration with Campus Recreation promotes prevention efforts through student intramural programs. Many social programs promote alcohol and drug awareness along with healthy behaviors through the Kimmel Leadership Center.

***Alcohol Policy:** The use, sale, delivery, possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages in or on any property owned or controlled by the University is strictly prohibited except as specifically provided in University Policy. University Police will enforce state law which prohibits sale to or possession of alcoholic beverages by persons under 21.

***Demonstrations:** The University prohibits demonstrations which: disrupt the regular and orderly performance of authorized University functions; interfere with the safety, welfare, and rights of members of the University community, University guests and local citizens; or are destructive of public or private property.

***Drug-Free Workplace.** The University is committed to maintaining a drug-free environment for its employees and students. The unlawful manufacture, distribution, possession or use of controlled substances is prohibited on property owned or controlled by the University. Policy information is published by the Chancellor (3/13/89) and in Drug-Free Campus Information materials published by the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs.

UNIVERSITY POLICE PROGRAMS:

Crime Prevention Programs are offered on numerous topics such as: Campus Crime; Personal Safety; Workplace Violence; and Sexual Assault. Programs are also developed on topics requested by the University community or as the need arises. From January 1, 2003 through December 31, 2003, 14 such programs were administered by the Police Department as a result of requests from various departments/student organizations within the University Community. Crime prevention brochures are available on various topics upon request to assist the University community in promoting crime prevention efforts on campus.

Housing/Student Affairs Liaison addresses law enforcement and security issues concerning Cougar Village apartments, Residence Halls, and all students. The Police Department participates in the orientation and training of housing staff. A weekly meeting consisting of a representative from Housing, a representative from Student Affairs, and a PD representative reviews police activity from the previous week.

Security Surveys provide recommendations for the reduction of security risks.

Campus Escort Service is available to those in need of a personal escort across campus for personal safety reasons.

Operation Identification is a program to deter the theft of valuables. Electric engravers are made available to members of the University community free of charge. Users are encouraged to engrave their driver's license number on valuables so that items can be identified by police and returned to their owner if stolen.

Educational Programs on safety related issues are offered by various units throughout the year. Programs are offered through the Kimmel Leadership Center, Health Services, Environmental Health & Safety, Housing, Counseling Services, Office of Human Resources (Personnel), and the Police Department. Collectively, these departments administered over 150 safety related programs to students, faculty, and staff over the course of calendar year 2004.

- **SEXUAL ASSAULT PREVENTION PROGRAMS** are offered by Counseling Services and include such topics as:

Acquaintance / Date Rape

familiarizes participants with the dynamics of acquaintance/date rape. Acquaintance and date rape are defined and the differences are discussed including contributing factors, societal myths, the effects of assault on the victim and personal safety measures.

Stranger Rape

defines stranger precipitated sexual assault and examines societal myths. Participants learn personal safeguards against victimization.

Rape Trauma Syndrome

outlines in detail the definition of Rape Trauma Syndrome (RTS), how to recognize the indicators and why knowledge of RTS is important for anyone in contact with sexual assault victims. Also discussed are ways in which one can be of assistance to someone suffering from RTS.

Child Sexual Abuse

defines child sexual abuse, characteristics of the offender, societal myths, indicators and how to handle disclosure of child sexual abuse.

Talking To Kids - Sexual Assault & Personal Safety

designed for groups of children ages 3-11 years. Personal safety and awareness of boundaries and personal space are discussed. Participants will be able to distinguish a "good" touch from a "questionable" or "bad" touch. Children are taught that they have the right to say "no" to behavior that makes them uncomfortable, and that they should immediately tell a parent or responsible adult.

Assessing Risk

teaches the definitions of sexual assault, how to assess personal risk and high risk in others, and how to develop strategies for personal safety. Also discussed are belief systems and how they can put us at risk.

Other Programs Include

Sexual Abstinence, Crisis Intervention and professional training for police and nursing students. A suicide intervention program is also offered by Counseling Services.

- **RELEASE OF STATISTICAL DATA IN COMPLIANCE WITH THIS ACT**
"Campus Security Officer" defined

In compliance with this Act, the University Police and the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs are classified as a "**campus security authority**." This means that any crimes reportable under this Act, which are reported to those Offices, or referrals made to the Office of Student Affairs for disciplinary action, are reported as a statistic in this report.

- **CRIME STATISTICS**

The Uniform Reporting of Crime (UCR) statistics by law enforcement agencies has been mandated by Illinois State law since 1972.

Thus, crime statistics pertaining to Southern Illinois University Edwardsville are available for review in the following publications: CRIME IN ILLINOIS, published by the Illinois State Police and CRIME IN THE UNITED STATES, published by the US Department of Justice.

Federal Law, 20 U.S.C. 1092(f), requires certain crime statistics be furnished to students and employees. This Act was amended in 1992, 1994, 1998 and 1999. The Annual Report, published by SIUE, has been updated accordingly.

The Act requires the use of standard FBI-UCR definitions for the compilation of statistical data. For sexual assault data, the Act requires the use of National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) rules pertaining to the presentation of data. This special statistical requirement for sex offenses is for nationwide standardization purposes, as it pertains to crimes of sexual assault.

- **INDEX CRIME DEFINITIONS**

1. **Criminal Homicide**

Murder and Non-negligent Manslaughter is the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another. *Manslaughter by Negligence* is the killing of another person through gross negligence.

2. **Sex Offenses - Forcible and Non-Forcible**

NIBRS defines sex offenses as forcible and non-forcible.

A forcible sex offense is any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent. Forcible sex offenses include forcible rape, forcible sodomy, sexual assault with an object, and forcible fondling.

Non-forcible sex offenses are acts of unlawful, non-forcible sexual intercourse. They include incest and statutory rape.

3. **Robbery / Armed Robbery**

is the taking of, or attempt to take, anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person by force, threat of force or violence, and/or putting the victim in fear of receiving serious personal injury.

4. **Aggravated Assault / Aggravated Battery**

Aggravated assault and/or attempted murder is the intentional causing of, or attempt to cause, serious bodily harm, or the threatening of serious bodily injury or death. *Aggravated battery* is the furtherance of the assault whereby physical contact is made resulting in great bodily harm.

5. **Burglary**

is the unlawful entry of a building, house trailer, water craft, aircraft, railroad car, or any part thereof, with intent to commit a felony or theft. This category includes attempts. NOTE: Burglary to Motor Vehicle statistics are not included in this category as that data is not required to be reported under the Clery Act.

6. **Vehicle Theft**

is the unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle. The category includes attempts.

7. **Arson / Aggravated Arson**

is the willful or malicious burning of, or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle, aircraft, or personal property.

8. **Hate Crime**

also known as a bias crime, is a criminal offense committed against a person, property or society which is motivated, in whole or in part, by the offender's bias against a race, religion, disability, sexual orientation, or ethnicity/national origin. (NIBRS Definition)

- 9. Arrests: Drug Offenses**
are violation of State and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs. The relevant substances include: opium or cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine); marijuana; synthetic narcotics (demerol, methadone); and dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbituates, benzedrine).
- 10. Arrests: Alcohol Offenses**
are violations of laws or ordinances prohibiting: the manufacture, sale, transporting, furnishing, purchase, possessing of intoxicating liquor, maintaining unlawful drinking places, bootlegging, operating a still; furnishing liquor to a minor or intemperate person; using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor; drinking on a train or public conveyance; and all attempts to do any of the above. (Note: Drunkenness and Driving Under the Influence (DUI) statistics are not included in this category as that data is not required to be reported under this Act.)
- 11. Arrests: Weapons Offenses**
are violations of laws or ordinances dealing with weapon offenses, regulatory in nature, such as: manufacture, sale or possession of deadly weapons; carrying deadly weapons, concealed or openly; furnishing deadly weapons to minors, aliens possessing deadly weapons; and all attempts to commit any of the aforementioned.
