COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

Completion of an Associate in Arts (AA) or Science (AS) degree at Lewis and Clark Community College (L&C) fulfills SIUE's general education requirements with the exception of an Interdisciplinary Studies course which must be taken during your junior or senior year at SIUE. All students who have not already had equivalent course work must satisfy SIUE's two-course Written Expression requirement with a grade of C or higher.

Beginning Fall 2012 the BA/BS distinction requirement for graduation goes into effect. See Special Note on next page for additional information.

One non-western culture course and one human relations course must be selected. This requirement can be met by several IAI Humanities/Fine Arts and Social/Behavioral Sciences selections. HIST 232 meets the human relations requirement. Either HIST 135 or 136 meets the non-western requirement. Minimum of 60 hours required for AA or AS degree at L&C.

SIUE Bachelor of Arts, History requires two years (4 semesters) of proficiency in a foreign language. This can be demonstrated either by examination or by university courses (16 hours). The foreign languages courses will meet the additional Humanities/Fine Arts requirements for an AA degree and elective areas.

- ^ C or better required in all history courses
- * HIST 135 and 136 are required for students preparing for certification to teach history or social studies.
- + Recommendation reflects SIUE's commitment to enhance students' analytic, problem-solving, and decision-making skills.
- ++ One IAI life science, one IAI physical science and one of those with lab are required for AA or AS
- *** AA requires an additional FA/HUMN elective (foreign language course will count as additional FA/HUMN); the AS requires an additional MATH/Science elective.

NOTE: Students seeking teacher certification are required to complete EDUC 231 and EDUC 241 with a grade of C or higher. Students with a history major who want to teach at the secondary level are also required to complete the Strong Social Science Minor (30 hours). Some of the courses (a grade of C or higher is required) are as follows: ANTH 232, SOCI 131, ECON 151, ECON 152, POLS 130, POLS 131, GEOG 132, GEOG 205, and PHSC 131.

NOTE: Regardless of how many community college semester hours are transferred into SIUE, students must earn at least 60 semester hours of the degree at an accredited four year institution with 30 semester hours of the degree completed at SIUE.

Special Note regarding the BA/BS distinction requirement effective Fall 2012:

Bachelor of Arts Degree requires completion of 8 courses in fine & performing arts (BFPA* or Bachelor FPA*) and humanities (BHUM* or HUM*) including two semesters of the same foreign language (FL*)

Bachelor of Science Degree Requires completion of 8 lecture courses in life (BLS* or LS*), physical (BPS* or PS*) or social science (BSS* or SS*) including 2 with labs (EL*)

*Approved courses are identified in the catalog with this designation. Lists of approved classes may also be obtained at siue.edu/registrar/genedguides.shtml or on the Course Equivalency Guides (CEG) at www.siue.edu.

IMPORTANT STUDENT NOTES:

The preceding information has been provided to assist you in your transfer process. In no way does this document substitute for meeting with an academic advisor. You are advised to meet on a regular basis with advisors at L&C and SIUE.

SIUE Bachelor of Arts in Historical Studies requires TWO YEARS (4 semesters) of proficiency in a foreign language. This can be demonstrated either by examination or by university courses. **Effective Fall 2012 additional requirements go into effect. See Special Note listed above.**

Declaring a History Major: To declare a major in History, it is necessary to have:

1. Completed all Academic Development courses required by the University;
2. Completed any required courses to address high school deficiencies;
3. A cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale);
4. Complete ENGL 131 and ENGL 132

Teacher Certification

In order to be admitted into the teacher certification program, students must have:

1. Received a grade of C or above in ENGL 131 and ENGL 132;
2. Successfully completed the introductory course CI 200 (SIUE) or EDUC 231 (L&C);
3. Completed 43 semester hours of course credit and have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher (this includes work at other institutions);
4. Passed the Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP), the website with information is <http://www.il.nesinc.com/index.asp>
5. Possess a 3.0 cumulative grade point average in all history courses, including those completed at other institutions.

Note: Students seeking secondary education certification after February 2012 must have grades of C or higher in all general education, major content and professional education courses. Grades of D are no longer accepted by the Illinois State Board of Education for certification purposes.
