History of A.M.E.C.

African Methodist Episcopal Church was founded by Richard Allen (below), Absalom Jones and other believers in 1787 in Philadelphia, Pa. Allen and a small group of members wanted to form an African congregation and later worshiped at Bethel A.M.E. which was dedicated to Allen as a pastor in 1794. The A.M.E.C. now has membership in 35 countries on five continents. The membership is estimated at 3 million and 7,000 congregations. Their mission is plain and simple. The church wants minister to the social, spiritual and physical development of all people.
