Research manuscripts are preferred but outstanding expository manuscripts may be acceptable. Only final (detailed) versions will be considered; abstracts and summary (preliminary) material are not acceptable. All manuscripts will be refereed.

Your final manuscript should be prepared using LaTeX or AMS-TeX. **We strongly recommend that you use the Contemporary Mathematics (proceedings) author package, listed below, which will properly format your manuscript for the series.**

Select Contemporary Mathematics (proceedings) in the pull down menu and then click on either LaTeX or AMS-TeX to obtain the appropriate package. You may have an older version of the package on your computer, so please be sure that you obtain the latest version from the website.

You will find instructions on creating graphics that are acceptable for publication. Please note that if your graphics are not prepared correctly, you will be required to fix them and resubmit your manuscript.

MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSION TO THE EDITORS:

- The deadline for manuscript submission is September 1, 2010. Please notify one of the editors if you do not plan to submit.

INSTRUCTIONS:

CONM is an author-prepared series which means that authors are responsible for the proper formatting of accepted manuscripts. There will be no proof copy prior to publication. The AMS will produce the volume directly from output from the **DVI** file provided by the author. **We strongly recommend the use of the Contemporary Mathematics (proceedings) author package** <http://www.ams.org/authors/procpackages.html>.

If you do not use the author package please be sure that the style you use remains consistent throughout the manuscript and that the following requirements are met. We recommend that you obtain the page layout grid which will give you a visual guide to the proper page dimensions. It is available from: <http://www.ams.org/authors/LayoutTemplate.html>

- Type size must be 10pt
- Type block
 - Page 1 should measure 5 x 6.5 inches or 12.7 x 16.5 centimeters (including the title)
 - All other pages should measure 5 x 8.4 inches or 12.7 x 21.4 centimeters (including running heads)
 - All text and graphics must fit within the type block

- Include:
 - Running heads
 - Footnote on the first page containing the 2010 MSC numbers for your paper: <http://www.ams.org/msc>
 - Author postal and email address(es) at the end of the paper
- Do not include:
 - Page numbers in an internal TOC
 - Page numbers at the bottom of a page (drop folios).

If you do not find the answer(s) you need, you should contact our Technical Support group via their special email address: author-support@ams.org making sure that you include CONM/Jarosz4 in your message to identify this volume.

Manuscripts that are not prepared according to the instructions or contain unacceptable graphics will be returned to authors for reformatting. Please be sure that you do not destroy any relevant electronic files. If you are unable to fix your manuscript, please contact the editor(s) of the volume for assistance.

The final responsibility for preparing manuscripts according to the instructions remains with the editor(s) of the volume. The AMS reserves the right to exclude from the volume any manuscripts that are not submitted in the appropriate form.

Some important notes are:

- figures should be created at the size they are to appear in the publication (no scaling)
- line weights (width) **must** be at least 0.5pt
- screens **must** be between 15% and 85%
- use of color graphics should be avoided or used only if it is mathematically *essential* to the paper. Approval must be obtained from the AMS Publisher for any color printing, and authors may be required to pay for all costs associated with producing color graphics.
- Graphics that are to be printed in black and white (grayscale) should be converted to grayscale before submitting to the AMS. Do not create a graphic in color if it is not to appear in color in the published product. These graphics should be saved as grayscale.
- \special commands must be compatible with Radical Eye Software's dvips. We recommend using the graphicx package to include graphics

If you used Scientific Workplace and you have graphics, please be sure that you remove any figure paths before typesetting the final manuscript. See Author FAQ: <http://www.ams.org/authors/author-faq.html> for more information.

- **If you are using any of your own material that has appeared elsewhere, you must obtain written permission from the original publisher, unless you retained copyright.** If you are unsure if permission is necessary, check the original publisher's rights and permissions guidelines specific to author's reuse of material.
- **You must obtain written permission to use another person's work, including figures, pictures, and quotations, whether or not it has been previously published.** Just adding an acknowledgment to your text does not constitute permission to publish the material.
- Authors are responsible for obtaining written permission(s), free of any restrictions which may limit the AMS's ability to produce, publish, promote, and distribute the volume in which your paper may appear, and forwarding these to the AMS along with your manuscript. Any permission which includes a restriction may result in the

- All permissions must be obtained prior to final submission of your manuscript to the AMS and you must send the permission to the AMS along with your manuscript.

MANUSCRIPT ACCEPTANCE – FINAL SUBMISSION to the AMS: The editor(s) will notify you directly if your paper has been accepted or rejected for the volume. The Contemporary Mathematics Editorial Committee will review the referee reports and grant final acceptance for the volume as a whole. Once the volume receives final approval you will receive detailed instructions from the editor(s) on how to submit your final manuscript to the AMS.

- Be prepared to submit your DVI, TeX, and any relevant EPS figure files via the AMS website: <http://www.ams.org/authors/submitlecms.html>. We use DVI files (not PDF) for production.
- You will need to complete an Interactive PDF file of the AMS Author Checklist
- Be prepared to email a PDF file of your paper along with the completed author checklist to me as the required “hard copy” submission. PDF FILES SHOULD NOT BE UPLOADED TO THE AMS WEBSITE.

GENERAL INFORMATION:
