What can I do with a degree in accounting?

Graduates of the accountancy program understand the environment in which business operates and can analyze how business operations are impacted by economic, social, political and legal environments.

The Bachelor of Science in accountancy provides the education required for many careers in the accounting discipline:

- Financial reporting
- Internal auditing
- Tax accounting
- Managerial accounting
- Not-for-profit accounting
- Certified management accountant
- Certified internal auditor

Most of our students aspire to become certified public accountants (CPAs), which requires 150 hours of college credit. Our Master of Science in accounting (MSA) program is designed to fulfill the additional 30 hours beyond the 120 hours required for the BSA. For

students completing their BSA who have earned at least 150 hours, our undergraduate curriculum meets the requirements to sit for the CPA exam in most states. Learn more about professional licensure disclosures for each state.

Accreditation

The SIUE Department of Accounting holds separate accounting accreditation from the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) International. Less than 2% of accounting programs in the world hold separate accreditation from the AACSB.

Admission Requirements cont.

To be admitted to the Bachelor of Science in accountancy program, students must:

Apply for admission and be accepted into the School of Business.
 Students who are not accepted into a program will not be allowed to enroll in 300- or 400-level business courses and will not be eligible to declare a major in accountancy.

Application Deadlines

- Summer Term and Fall Semester: March 1
- Spring Semester: October 1

Graduation Requirements

- Cumulative University GPA required: 2.5
- Accounting GPA (in all required accounting courses taken at SIUE): 2.5
- Business GPA (in all required business courses taken at SIUE): 2.25
- C or higher in Management 441 (meets University Senior Assignment)

- C or higher in courses marked with * in the Degree Requirements section
- Students must complete all 300- and 400-level business course requirements at SIUE or another AACSB-accredited business school. Once admitted to the School of Business, students seeking a major or minor in the School of Business must obtain prior approval from the School of Business before taking upper-level (300- or 400-level) business coursework at another institution that is intended to satisfy a major or minor requirement.
