Greetings,

Thank you for your continued interest in the SIUE MPA program. We continue to experience challenging times as the university community and the world perseveres amid the COVID-19 pandemic. For nearly one year, we have adapted to withstand this public health crisis. The need for efficient and effective public administrators in all levels of government remains evident. Federal, state and local organizations are experiencing new and more complex demands in delivering vital public services. We as a community, state and nation exhibit hope and optimism for the vaccine distribution that is currently underway.

The Department of Public Administration at SIUE is flourishing despite the stressful and uncertain times we face. In the fall 2021 term, we will commence a fully online MPA. This online option will not replace our traditional degree. With the surging request for online courses and remote capability, our fully online MPA is in high demand.

In October 2020, our tenured faculty member Dr. Morris Taylor was promoted to Vice Chancellor of Administration at SIUE. In receiving this promotion, the department had to say good-bye to Dr. Taylor as teaching faculty. We thank Dr. Taylor for his years of dedication and contributions to PAPA. The department is currently working to fill his faculty position and we look forward to announcing a new faculty member prior to fall 2021.



FACULTY SPOT LIGHT



Dr. Morris Taylor

This past October, Dr. Morris Taylor was appointed the Vice Chancellor for Administration (VCA) at SIUE. Dr. Taylor succeeds Rich Walker, who retired at the end of September. They had the opportunity to work together for two weeks during the transitions.

Before taking on this new position, Dr. Taylor chaired the SIUE Department of Public Administration and Policy Analysis for 6 years. Dr. Taylor has been an SIUE faculty member since 1997 and brings 22 years of experience in higher education to the position. At SIUE, he has taught courses in public management, policy analysis, public law, program evaluation, ethics, homeland security and public safety. He is an editor for the Journal of Public Management and Social Policy.

During his SIUE tenure, Dr. Taylor has been extensively involved in campus leadership. He has served as the chair of various committees, including the Planning Budgeting Council (UPBC), Faculty Senate Rules and Procedures Committee, College of Arts and Sciences Academic Policies and Curriculum Committee, and the Thesis Committee. He has also served on the Chancellor's Council, University Leadership Team, Enrollment Management Council, Extended Chancellor's Council University Quality Council, Provost's Space Committee, Teaching Excellence Award Committee, Graduate Council Program Committee, and Graduate Studies and Research Committee.

Prior to joining SIUE, Dr. Taylor was an administrator with the Social Security Administration in St. Louis. He was a police officer for both St. Louis City and St. Louis County during the 1970s. He was also a senior attorney negotiator for State Farm Insurance Co. from 2004-2005. In addition, he served as the Ira Glasser Racial Justice Fellow for the American Civil Liberties Union of Eastern Missouri.

Dr. Taylor's public and community service include being a member of the United States Attorneys' Hate Crime Task Force for Eastern Missouri, the board of directors for St. Louis Area Regional Response System (STARRS), the Southwestern Illinois City Manager Association (SWICMA), the ACLU of Eastern Missouri, and variety of other public policy-focused organizations.

Dr. Taylor earned a bachelor's in liberal studies from Saint Louis University (SLU) in 1985 with a specialization in organizational development. He earned a master's in public administration from SIUE in 1992 and doctorate in public policy analysis with a specialization in social jurisprudence from SLU in 2000.

MPA INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Overview

An integral part of the MPA at SIUE is the professional internship program. Through internships, MPA students combine their acquired classroom knowledge with experience in nonprofit organizations, local governments, and various government agencies. In fact, over the past 20 years, MPA interns have supported more than 75 local, regional, and national organizations.

Students attend courses specifically designed for training future public administrators, while performing the functions of a professional intern in specifically selected government and nonprofit organizations across the St. Louis metro region.

The internship program provides MPA students with the opportunity to cultivate their skills and knowledge through applied work assignments. At the same time, organizations benefit from having professionally trained graduate students carry out significant tasks and projects at reasonable compensation rates, with the support of the MPA faculty and staff. Potential internship projects include conducting surveys, writing grants, assessing programs, and working with citizen groups.

Who are MPA interns?

Our interns come from a variety of backgrounds with bachelor's degrees from many different fields. Their career interests are varied and their desire to learn and engage in significant duties is intense. Many interns bring past professional experience to their internship duties, while others have recently earned their undergraduate degrees.

How are interns assigned?

MPA faculty work with organizations to identify and select qualified interns from the MPA student pool. Interns are assigned on a semester basis, with the option of multiple semesters.

Agencies have the option of arranging 15- or 20-hour work weeks. Supervision of the intern is a joint responsibility between the local agency and the internship director in the PAPA Department at SIUE.

What is the role of an internship site?

The internship site selects the project on which the intern is to work, assigns responsibilities, and sets work parameters. The intern enters the relationship with the understanding that the individual will follow the operating procedures of the organization.

Where are our interns now?

Our interns have gone on to successful career positions as executive directors of nonprofit organizations, city administrators, federal agency managers, regional economic developers, and more!

MPA INTERNSHIP CERTIFICATE OF APPRECIATION

Edwardsville Township, IL

Each year, the PAPA Department selects internship partners to highlight and acknowledge through the issuance of a certificate of appreciation. For 2021, this honor was bestowed upon Beth Behrhorst and Fred Schulte with Edwardsville Township.

MPA interns from the Township have left the agency after graduating to make their mark in careers with Madison County government, the City of Edwardsville, BJC HealthCare, the St. Louis Art Museum, and many other organizations across the region and the country. Some have continued their studies, pursuing degrees in law and other graduate programs, as well as professional certificates that complement their SIUE education.

Graduate interns help the Township in many ways—assisting the administrator with the preparation of important board documents and grant applications, updating the Township's website to comply with State transparency requirements, and supporting the community outreach coordinator to deliver essential services to low-income seniors, families and individuals. Additionally, SIUE interns assist in coordinating the details of the Township's Lunch and Learn workshops.

"These workshops tackle important issues of substance in today's world, such as human trafficking, domestic violence, pandemic response, diversity and inclusion, and more," said Bethany Behrhorst, Edwardsville Township administrator and alumna of SIUE's MPA program (2002). "Through these programs, community partnerships are formed and strengthened, and more people are helped through improved access to services. Representatives from area governmental agencies and service providers are connected with each other to discuss these relevant, timely issues and develop a coordinated response."

Behrhorst added the intentional coordination proved to be extremely beneficial during the Township's pandemic response.

"Because of our partnerships, which have been nurtured through the years, and strengthened through these workshops, we were able to not only help residents, but triage and lead them to other governmental units and nonprofit agencies," she said. "This augmented the level of support people received. Additionally, our interns were instrumental in the Township's response. I am so impressed by their adaptability and willingness to step in and get things done. That is a testament to the strength of SIUE's MPA program."





SIUE MPA interns also assist with the coordination of the Township's annual Touch-A-Truck event at Edwardsville Township Community Park. While the event is free and open to the public, drawing thousands of parents, grandparents, and children to Edwardsville Township Community Park for a fun-filled day of exploring a mix of vehicles and helicopters, area businesses sponsor the event at several donation levels. While last year's event was canceled due to the pandemic, more than \$20,000 was raised in 2019. Money raised is used to support Main Street Community Center in Edwardsville and other organizations that assist seniors, families, and individuals in need throughout the community.


Grant Litteken
