




Mount Hope Cemetery Located in Belleville Illinois. Established 1884. Big cemetery 127 acres overall, 60 acres developed

























Freemasons and The Sisterhood of the Eastern Star

- The Freemasons were transported from England sometime between 1720 and 1730.
- Based on the Liberal ideas of enlightenment.
- Symbol is comprised of a Square and Compass in the shape of a quadrilateral.
- Sometimes the letter G appears inbetween them.
- Sisterhood of the Eastern Star originated around 1857 for women
- Symbol is a Five Pointed star



Independent Order of Odd Fellows

- Also Originated in England and transferred to America in 1819, more than a hundred years after the Freemasons
- The main symbol is three rings that denote Friendship, Love, Truth.
- Differentiated from Freemasonry by offering a form of Mutual benefits to members.
- It is not uncommon to find with other benefit offering Fraternities
- By the end of the 19th century The Odd Fellows rivaled freemasonry in membership.



Woodmen of the World or W.O.W

- The Modern Woodmen of America was started in 1883, by Joseph Cullen <u>Root!</u>
- Eventually Root was expelled because of a feud with a head member
- He then started Woodmen of the World
- The Early Woodmen certificates offered Tombstone and Death Benefits for members
- The society originally barred members who worked hazardous occupations
- The W.O.W Symbol is a sawed off tree stump, and their motto is Family, Fraternity, Protection, and Service
