Make a copy and leave it with a family member. ☐ Do you know what the baggage limit is for your airline (number of bags, weight & size restrictions)? If not, find out now. ☐ Do you have all of your prescription medicine? ☐ Have you checked with the embassy to be sure that none of the prescription drugs you plan to take abroad are illegal in that country? ☐ Purchase dictionary and/or phrasebook for language host country. ☐ Do you have a journal and address book to carry with you? ☐ ATM Card – Do you plan to take yours? Check with your bank to see if it will work abroad. Check to make sure PIN can be used overseas. Check daily limit.
