LBSI Endorsement Courses (Post – Graduation):

The special education (LBS1) endorsement may be added onto existing license (type 03, 04, 09 or 10) and, therefore, limits the holder to the grade ranges of the existing license. Required coursework includes: SPE 502, 511, 522, 523 and 540. To receive the endorsement, teachers must meet these coursework requirements for an approval and pass the cross-categorical special education test (LBSI #155).

PROGRAM APPLICATIONS: students should submit their application online to their program of choice even if they are in the process of meeting declaration requirements or eligibility requirements. Check with your SEHNB Advisor in in January to verify your courses and grade point average that will be submitted to the admission committee. Applications are available January through March 1st of each year for fall Admission. The Early Childhood Education program begins every Fall semester!
