Recommended Curricular Path

Music Theory and Aural Skills (MUS 125a/Mus 126) 4 hrs

Note: All students wishing to enroll in Mus 125a are required to take a diagnostic exam administered by the Music Theory faculty. If the student performs poorly on the diagnostic then they must enroll in either Mus 124 (Music Fundamentals for non-majors) or Mus 120A and Mus 120B (Music Fundamentals for majors in music). These remedial courses are insufficient for music theory questions on the Content Exam. Therefore, success in the fundamentals course(s) will allow the endorsement seeker to begin the endorsement path by enrolling in Mus 125a and Mus 126.
