Terms and Conditions, 2026-2027

Scholarship Details

The Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship is valid Fall and Spring semester for one year. The scholarship will be credited to the student's university account each semester. By accepting this scholarship as part of your financial aid award you agree to the terms and conditions of the scholarship detailed herein.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship in combination with other scholarships and financial aid

The Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship will be applied to university charges on the student's account such as tuition, fees, housing and meal plan. Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship will be considered funds to meet financial need in the packaging of financial aid. Should the crediting of the scholarship in combination with other financial aid result in excess funds on the student's account, the excess may be refunded to the student for personal expenses and books.

Academic Performance and Student Conduct

Renewal of the scholarship requires a 2.90 cumulative grade point average. In addition to the renewal requirements for the scholarship, Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship recipients must also abide by the University academic policy as stated in the catalog and student handbook, the Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy for financial aid and scholarship recipients, and the Student Conduct Code.

Scholarship recipients should keep address changes up to date with the University and check SIUE email often for important announcements.

Awarding Criteria

- Incoming domestic first-year or transfer student.
- Member of Phi Theta Kappa at a community college.
- Minimum 3.5 cumulative transfer GPA.
 - First-year students (high school students) must submit their transfer transcript to be evaluated for this award. Their high school GPA will not be considered.
