

SIUE Health Service is working closely with Madison County Health Department and the Illinois Department of Public Health in conjunction with the CDC guidelines to address the threat presented by the Novel Coronavirus 2019-CoV.

Faculty and staff should contact their private physician if they experience new onset respiratory symptoms. (Students who present to our office with new onset respiratory symptoms will be screened for possible exposure to the virus per recommended guidelines. CDC believes that 2019-nCoV may appear between 2 -14 days after exposure. Travel to Wuhan, China or coming into contact with anyone who has traveled to Wuhan, China is part of the screening.)
