Languages

Conversational Japanese: This course is designed to help students with little or no previous experience with the Japanese language. Participants will learn basic introductions, greetings and vocabulary used to describe common items and experiences. Pronunciation will be practiced, and basic Japanese conversation will be introduced, along with learning about Japanese culture. No textbook is needed for the course. The instructor will provide handouts.

Beginning Spanish: This course will introduce the Spanish language to those with little to no knowledge of it.

Introduction to American Sign Language and Deaf Culture: This is an overview of American Sign Language (ASL) and its basic vocabulary, structure, syntax and grammar. Participants will focus on mastering the basics of fingerspelling, numbers, colors, facial grammar and sentence structure. Participants will also learn conversational and cultural behaviors necessary to hold a beginning-level conversation in ASL with deaf or hearing-impaired users of the language. Introductory information about deaf culture will also be presented, along with deaf humor, to provide students with a broad picture of language and culture.

Course Fee: \$99 (with parking \$126) Thursdays, 7-9 p.m., February 21-April 18 SIUE Main Campus Beginning German I: This course introduces students to the fundamentals of the German language and culture. No prior knowledge of the language is necessary. Participants of the course are required to purchase the textbook "Deutsch: Na Klar!" sixth edition separately from the course cost.

Dialogue sections will be provided in Greek and English. The dialogues are from live videos filmed in Greece. Textbook and all supporting materials are included in the cost of the course.

Elements covered in this course include creating and managing multiple worksheets, rearranging data, working with basic formulas and formatting, inserting charts and graphics, and sorting and organizing large amounts of data. A brief introduction to Windows is included. Basic mouse and keyboarding skills are required for this course. Textbook and online resource materials are provided.

Microsoft Excel: Intermediate Level: Designed for students with previous Microsoft Excel experience, this intermediate-level course will expand the user's Excel 2016 skill set with projects that demonstrate the application's higher capabilities. Topics covered in this course include creating formulas that use

data in multiple worksheets, working with advanced formulas and formatting, inserting charts and graphics, and writing functions. Introductory Excel 2016 knowledge and skills are required for this course; however, a brief review of basic Excel 2016 formulas will be included. Online resource materials are provided.

Certified Personal Trainer Course: Get all the information needed to start an exciting fitness career and become a Certified Personal Trainer. Presented by World Instructor Training Schools (WITS), this personal trainer course is a great way to become a successful Certified Personal Trainer with an option to complete an employer internship that can walk you into jobs! This challenging hybrid course consists of 15 hours of online lectures on key topics like biomechanics, exercise physiology, fitness testing, equipment usage and health assessment, along with 15 hours of hands-on practical training labs with role-playing drills on assessing clients, programming, performing proper exercises, presentation skills and more.

Included in this course is access to online student study tools and a voucher to take the Certified Personal Trainer exams during the last class session. You can work right after passing the exams with proof of CPR/AED to be a Level 1 Certified Personal Trainer. As a special bonus, you can take advantage of our 30-hour employer internship to get our advanced Level 2 Certified Personal Trainer credential at no additional cost!

WITS is an approved continuing education unit (CEU) provider for the American Occupational Therapy Association, National Certification Board for Therapeutic Massage and Bodywork, and the International Association of Continuing Education and Training. The American Council on Education has recommended three undergraduate academic credits for this course.

Online and Hybrid Courses

Beer, Wine and Spirits

Beer, Wine and Spirits 101: The online course provides the basics of the history, styles and brewing methods of beer, wine and spirits. The applied brewing methods lab allows students to create their own products for personal use and consumption. This online course is designed to include modules that allow the student to take the course at their own pace.

Beer, Wine and Spirits 102: This course is offered in-person, in a lab format and in a series of four Saturday morning sessions. Students in this course will learn to create their own brewing products for personal consumption and participate in sampling sessions to study brewing products through sensory analysis. Participants must be 21 or older.

Dates and times are TBD depending on a minimum enrollment of 12 students. Lab sessions will take place at the Biotechnology Laboratory Incubator, SIUE University Park.

Psychology: Organizational Talent Management Series

Surveys 1: Developing High-Impact Surveys:

Data-driven decision making is a hallmark of organizational life, but the quality of any data-driven initiative is only as good as the data used in that decision. This course will focus on providing the skills to understand how to maximize survey efforts in your organization. This course will inform students to become skilled consumers of external survey systems and provide basic understanding of how to create surveys that will be reliable and valid.

Course Fee: \$299 Three sessions are available: January 14-February 15 February 18-March 29 April 1-May 3

Surveys 2: Survey Analysis for Data-Driven

Decision Making: (Surveys Part 1 is a pre-requisite) This course builds on Surveys 1 by providing an in-depth understanding of the recommended approaches for administering, interpreting, communicating and making decisions based on organizational surveys. This course will instruct students on how to successfully interpret and communicate the results of organizational surveys. This course will focus on providing the skills to understand how to maximize survey response and analyze the results of surveys.

Course Fee: \$299 Three sessions are available: January 14-February 15 February 18-March 29 April 1-May 3

Surveys 3: Elevating Your Hiring Process Using

Structured Interviews: Selection of the right employees is an important human resources function. The most common selection tool is the inperson interview. This course will focus on providing the skills to understand how to maximize selection accuracy through best practices in interview design, interviewing skills and consistent interview scoring in your organization. This course will inform students to become skilled consumers of externally available structured interviews and provide basic understanding of how to create structured interviews to improve successful hiring.

Course Fee: \$299 *Three sessions are available:* January 14-February 15 February 18-March 29 April 1-May 3

Online psychology courses are self-paced, but material is sequential. Each course will be active for a five-week period.


