Students who are not admitted to the School of Pharmacy, or who change career paths, may take longer than four years to complete the Bachelor's Degree.

Students who have earned degrees (Associates, Bachelors, Masters, Doctoral Degrees) are still required to complete the pre-pharmacy curriculum equivalencies. All students should meet with an academic advisor in the SIUE School of Pharmacy to discuss applicability of coursework.
