

#### **WHAT IS A FIC?**

Focused Interest Communities (FICs) let students connect with peers who have the same interests and experiences. Students live together in a residence hall wing and share study and social lounges. FICs have specific programs throughout the year that help students adjust to their first year of college, make connections with faculty, and create a bond with SIUE.



# THE HONORS FIC

The Honors FIC is supported by University Housing and the University Honors Program. Spaces in the Honors FIC are reserved for students accepted into the University Honors Program. Students share honors courses, and may have other courses with honors students in their major.

### WHAT STUDENTS SAY

"My favorite part about being in the Honors Program is the inclusive and tight-knit family that the students form, especially while living in the Honors FIC. We challenge each other intellectually, learn from each other, and support each other."

### WHAT MAKES US DIFFERENT

The first semester of college can be intense, especially for high-performing students. We encourage students to live with others who are having similar experiences in their classes. Because we have students from every major on campus, honors students can form their own major-focused groups, especially for support in their first semester courses. We also work closely with University Housing to provide the right mix of programming and support for all FIC students.

# WHAT ABOUT OTHER FICS?

The University has other major- and interest-related FICs, all of which are open to honors students as well. You can choose any of them, but our honors students have this to say:

"I didn't live in the Honors FIC, but I felt welcome there. Being in the honors classes mean you really get to know those people. The Honors FIC is very social, and I still found plenty of people in my major there. That made studying for major classes easier because I knew people, which was harder in my major FIC. I was lucky to meet people in the Honors FIC, and I'm glad to be living in the upperclass Honors FIC next year."
