Overview of Course

This course is being offered entirely online. There are no meetings on campus. The assigned activities are designed to complement, in part, the lecture material presented in CHEM 120A. The lab component will demonstrate how the basic principles of chemistry can be experimentally verified as well as how they are applied to chemical problems. Knowledge of chemical laboratory techniques and procedures is extremely useful to a health care professional when dealing with clinical laboratory results. This online lab experience will be helpful to gain a better understanding of such techniques.

Time Commitment: To earn a passing grade, students taking Chem 124a online in the Winter Term should expect to spend at least 12 hours a week on this Laboratory course.

Computer Requirements and Access: Each student must have unlimited access to a computer with internet access, a webcam, microphone, and speakers. The computer must have Adobe Acrobat Reader™, and MS Office™. Currently enrolled students can download and install Microsoft Office on up to five computers by visiting: http://office365.siue.edu. You will need to use your full SIUE email address (NOT just your e-ID) and e-ID password to log in. The subscription also includes full access to MS Office applications for iPhone and Android devices.

Blackboard Login: When logging into Blackboard, use your University e-ID and password. Lab Reports: Each set of activities including an online lab report will be worth 100 pts. The distribution of points for each set of activities may vary depending on the nature of the assignment.

Your final course grade will be determined based on the average of all assignments. Opportunities to earn extra credit *may* be available at the end of the course.
