Completion of an Associate in Arts or Science degree at College of Lake County fulfills SIUE's general education requirements, with the exception of an Interdisciplinary Studies course that all students must take during their junior and senior year at SIUE.

This "Transfer Program Guide" is an **example** of proposed curriculum for students to use while completing the Associate's degree. Reading, writing and math placement could alter the course sequencing and transfer date. Therefore students should begin sequencing their reading/writing (if applicable) and math & science courses during the first semester, paying close attention to prerequisites. Students have the option of taking summer classes to lessen fall and spring course loads.

PRE-DECLARATION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE BACHELOR OF SCIENCE - BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

- A cumulative GPA of 2.25 (on a 4.0 scale) in all college level coursework
- Completion of ENG 121, MTH 122 or MTH 145, and ECO 221 or ECON 222 with grades of "C" or higher

Declaration into the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration requires admission to the School of Business and a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS TO SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

- Admission to SIUE.
- Completion of pre-requisite courses: ENG 121, ENG 122, CMM 121, AMT 112, ECO 221, ECO 222, ACC 121, MTH 122, and MTH 224 with grades of "C" or higher (Students may substitute MTH 145 for both MTH 122 and MTH 224).
- An application for the School of Business; Applications are available at http://www.siue.edu/business/.
- Preferred application deadline for SUMMER or FALL admission is March 1. Above pre-requisite courses for summer admittance must be completed by the end of the preceding spring term; above pre-requisite courses for fall admittance must be completed by the end of the preceding summer term.
- Preferred application deadline for SPRING admission is October 1. Above pre-requisite courses for spring admittance must be completed by the end of the preceding fall term.

Applications are reviewed every week; students are notified within 1-2 weeks after review.

SCHOOL OF BUSINESS RETENTION AND GRADUATION POLICY

- Students must maintain a 2.25 cumulative GPA
- Students who do not meet this requirement for two consecutive semesters will be removed from the program

SIUE Business Administration students choose from among the following specializations: Computer Information Systems, Cybersecurity, Data Analytics, Economics, Entrepreneurship, Finance, Human Resource Management, International Business, Management, Marketing, and Supply Chain Management.
