Completion of an Associate in Arts or Science degree at Lincoln Land Community College fulfills SIUE's general education requirements with the exception of an Interdisciplinary Studies course that all students must take during their junior or senior year at SIUE.

This "Transfer Program Guide" is an *example* of proposed curriculum for students to use while completing their associate's degree. Reading, writing, and math placement could alter the course sequencing and transfer date. Therefore, students should begin sequencing their reading/writing (if applicable) and math & science courses during the first semester, paying particular attention to prerequisites. Students have the option of taking summer classes to lessen fall and spring course loads.

It is highly recommended that students meet with a Lincoln Land College advisor; for additional information please contact the SIUE coordinator for advising and partnership programs.

**ADDITIONAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS/INFORMATION**

For all applicants, Seven Prerequisite courses (C or higher required in each course) EGL 101, EGL 102, CMN 101/104, ECO 131 ECO 132, MAT 113, CSC 115 (Accounting majors need a "B" or higher in ACC 103. MAT 131 (Calculus) or higher-level mathematics is allowed in place of MAT 130. Math 141 MAT 130, ACC 103 are required, but are not prerequisites. Students should be encouraged to complete MAT 141.

Students must have a 2.25 GPA to apply (2.5 GPA for Accounting). The GPA is determined by all college level coursework taken at all higher education institutions. Our intention is to admit students who demonstrate the greatest likelihood of success. Decisions are based primarily on student performance in collegiate-level work as expressed in the grade point averages and the required essay. Due to the competitive nature of the admission process, not all students who apply are admitted.
