Completion of an Associate in Arts or Science degree at Lincoln Land Community College fulfills SIUE’s general education requirements with the exception of an Interdisciplinary Studies course that all students must take during their junior or senior year at SIUE.

This “Transfer Program Guide” is an *example* of proposed curriculum for students to use while completing their associate’s degree. Reading, writing, and math placement could alter the course sequencing and transfer date. Therefore, students should begin sequencing their reading/writing (if applicable) and math & science courses during the first semester, paying particular attention to prerequisites. Students have the option of taking summer classes to lessen fall and spring course loads.

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IMPORTANT STUDENT NOTES:

Admission Requirements

To declare a major in elementary education, it is necessary to have:

Completed any required academic development and high school deficiency courses

Received a grade of "C" or better in EGL 101 and EDU 201 (or equivalent course)

A cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher at all institutions and be in good academic standing at SIUE

In order to be formally admitted to an elementary education cohort, it is necessary to have:

Declared as an elementary education major

All foundations courses must be completed with a "C" or higher. (Foundations courses are: EGL 101, EGL 102, CMN 101, PHI 201 and MAT 105)

Received a grade of "C" or better in EGL 102, MAT 113

A cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher at all institutions and be in good academic standing at SIUE

Completion of 42 semester hours or more of college-level coursework

Completed an application for admission to the elementary education program. This application along with transcripts of all coursework should be submitted by **February 1** for fall admission.

ELEMENTARY EDUCATION APPLICATION DEADLINE: February 1

February 1: Students seeking admission for the following fall term. Applications will be available on our website in September.
