

Associate of Arts MAJOR Special Education

Completion of an Associate in Arts or Science degree at Lincoln Land Community College fulfills SIUE's general education requirements with the exception of an Interdisciplinary Studies course that all students must take during their junior or senior year at SIUE.

This "Transfer Program Guide" is an *example* of proposed curriculum for students to use while completing their associate's degree. Reading, writing, and math placement could alter the course sequencing and transfer date. Therefore, students should begin sequencing their reading/writing (if applicable) and math & science courses during the first semester, paying particular attention to prerequisites. Students have the option of taking summer classes to lessen fall and spring course loads.

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Special Education Admission Requirements:

*A course that satisfies both the ERGU and EREG requirement will only be counted as one and not both.

*Students must be admitted to SIUE prior to submitting an application to the School of Education, Health, and Human Behavior.

*Application deadline for admission for Fall term is February 1.

Admission Requirements:

- 1. Completion of all skills/foundations courses (or approved equivalents) with a grade of C or better.
- 2. The grade of B or higher in EDU 215 Intro to Special Ed.
- 3. Fewer than 5 non-partnership courses remaining.
- 4. Combined GPA (all post-secondary work) of 2.5 or higher.
- 5. Good academic standing at SIUE (if applicable)
- 6. Completion of 42 semester hours or more of college level course work.
