

# Southwestern Illinois College Associate in Arts BUSINESS - Accountancy

Completion of an Associate in Arts or Science degree at Southwestern Illinois College fulfills SIUE's general education requirements, with the exception of an Interdisciplinary Studies course that all students must take during their junior and senior year at SIUE.

This "Transfer Program Guide" is an **example** of proposed curriculum for students to use while completing their associate's degree. Reading, writing and math placement could alter the course sequencing and transfer date. Therefore students should begin sequencing their reading/writing (if applicable) and math & science courses during the first semester, paying close attention to prerequisites. Students have the option of taking summer classes to lessen fall and spring course loads.

The Associate degree requires students to complete one Human Relations course and one Non-Western Course. These requirements may be met with a Fine Arts, Humanities, Social Science, or Behavioral Science.

#### PRE-DECLARATION REQUIREMENTS FOR BACHELOR OF SCIENCE - ACCOUNTANCY (BSA)

- A cumulative GPA of 2.25 (on a 4.0 scale) in all college level coursework
- Completion of ENG 101, MATH 112, and ECON 201 or ECON 202 with grades of "C" or higher

Declaration into the Bachelor of Science – Accountancy (BSA) requires admission to the School of Business and a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.

#### **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS TO SCHOOL OF BUSINESS**

- Admission to SIUE
- Completion of pre-requisite courses: ENG 101, ENG 102, COMM 151, BUS 209 or CIS 185, ECON 201, ECON 202, MATH 112, MATH 213 or MATH 203, and ACCT 110 with grades of "C" or higher
- An application for the School of Business; Applications are available at http://www.siue.edu/business/.
- Application deadline for SUMMER or FALL admission is March 1. Above pre-requisite courses for summer admittance must be completed by the end of the preceding spring term; above pre-requisite courses for fall admittance must be completed by the end of the preceding summer term.
- Application deadline for SPRING admission is October 1. Above pre-requisite courses for spring admittance must be completed by the end of the preceding fall term.
- SIUE Students may not repeat MATH 213/203 or ACCT 110 more than two times

Additional required courses (although not required for admission to the School of Business) that SIUE students may not repeat more than twice are BUS 205/MATH 191 and ACCT 111; Both of these courses can possibly be completed with the associate's degree. For additional information regarding the repeat policy for other undergraduate business courses, it is strongly recommended students meet with the SIUE Site Coordinator on SWIC's campus.

\*A course that satisfies both the ERGU and EREG requirement will only be counted as one and not both.

### SCHOOL OF BUSINESS RETENTION AND GRADUATION POLICY

- Students must maintain a 2.5 cumulative GPA
- Students who do not meet this requirement for two consecutive semesters will be removed from the program
