#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES:**

Minutes for the October 7, 2021 meeting were approved as written.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

Condolences were offered to the SIUE Police for the loss of Officer Tyler Timmins.

#### **REPORTS:**

Becherer reminded the body that feedback on the Chancellor candidates is due on November 5. He reported that he was invited to attend the System Staff Development working committee. There was discussion about sponsoring a lobby day.

Balai shared information about Staff Development at a system level, and the committee is looking at things that the campuses could do together. A survey has been sent out to all staff to get feedback on what topics to work on first. There is concern about burnout since there are many employees leaving, and those remaining have to pick up the extra work.

President Ferrell has an upcoming meeting with the Chancellor.

Cherry reported that he plans to meet with Dr. Jessica Harris about her priorities to help inform what the Diversity Initiatives Committee will work on. The First Generation Celebration Day will take place on November 8 with an expanded celebration that is also partnered with Carbondale.

The Chancellor Search Committee work has completed. The committee shared strengths and weaknesses of finalists with the System President.

Hunter shared that the Faculty Senate is working on language for their Bylaws to allow for remote attendance in accordance with Open Meetings Act restrictions.

Reports from the Public Relations Committee, the Diversity Initiatives Committee, the Parking and Traffic Committee, the University Planning and Budget Council (UPBC), the Homecoming Committee, and the Honorary Degree and Distinguished Service Award Committee (HDDSAC) were posted to Teams and are attached.

There were no other reports.

#### **ACTION ITEMS:**

Kelly Jo Hendricks was recommended as the Staff Senate appointment to the Committee for Higher Administrator Performance Appraisal (CHAPA). There was no discussion, and the appointment was approved unanimously.

#### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

Ferrell will meet with Becherer to move the employee satisfaction survey forward. The Staff Senate may be able to use information from the system survey as well. Kessinger expressed concerns that people could become more discouraged if there is no action to remedy issues after the surveys.

Announcements were reviewed as listed on the agenda.

There will be a limited platform party for commencement that will not include the Staff Senate at this time, but there will be follow up to make sure that representation is not lost when a full party resumes.
