Brief description of the nature of the research/creative activity?

The project work associated with this position is focused on student, faculty, and registered nurse well-being and self-care. This work is of utmost importance in the healthcare industry currently, as healthcare professions face significant burnout, predicted staff shortages, and resignation rates after the COVID-19 pandemic. The specific focus of project work for the fall 2024 semester will be securing funding to support an academic intervention tailored to undergraduate nursing students to embed principles of well-being into the curriculum and educational preparation. Further, the work will extend to designing workplace interventions to enhance a healthy work environment, which is aligned with the AACN Healthy Work Environment Standards.

Brief description of student responsibilities?

Students work will include a variety of activities which may include actively engaging in the project design, recruitment, data collection, data entry/analysis (with guidance from the URCA mentor), collaboration within research teams, and leading components of the intervention. As a member of this project team, URCA assistants will be empowered to speak up, provide suggestions, and engage as a researcher. Students may be asked to assist with writing and editing as well as developing dissemination materials such as posters and PowerPoint slides.
