Brief description of the nature of the research/creative activity?

Students will have the opportunity to design an experimental study that explores variables relating to different aspects of social media. Prior projects have explored the relationship between peer belongingness, loneliness and social media use, the relationship between narcissism and social media behaviors, and envy and social media behaviors. These projects are typically created for an online format but as more research is coming back to in-person, there will be chances to run in-person studies.

Brief description of student responsibilities?

Students conduct peer reviewed literature searches, write-up IRB applications, help with data collection procedures (i.e., in-person lab experiments, going into schools for data collection, creating online surveys), organize data sets (using SPSS, Qualtrics, etc.), and assist with running analysis for projects (analyzing and coding data in Qualtrics). Students will have the opportunity to submit and create conference posters, as well as assist on writing manuscripts.
