#### Brief description of the nature of the research/creative activity?

Students will work on research within the area of adult mental health, broadly defined, and possibly more in general psychopathology factor (p factor), personality pathology, and psychosocial adjustment. We will read articles in this area, brainstorm research ideas, analyze data, and submit them for a conference presentation.

## Brief description of student responsibilities?

The main student responsibilities will be related to research question generation and data analysis. Therefore, (1) students should be interested in the above-stated research area (personality, psychosocial adjustment, mental disorders); (2) students should be prepared to read research articles and actively participate in discussions during lab meetings, and (3) students should be ready to be independent thinkers.
