Community-Oriented Digital Engagement Scholars Program (CODES) Terms and Conditions, 2024-2025

Award Details

All CODES Scholarship recipients will be held to the terms and conditions of the scholarship detailed herein. The CODES Scholarship is valid fall and spring semesters and will be continued, if renewal conditions are met, for eight semesters across four academic years. The CODES Scholarship is valued at the full undergraduate tuition for up to 18 credit hours per semester. The SIUE CODES Scholarship supersedes all other SIUE scholarships of equal or lesser value and cannot be combined with those awards.

The CODES Scholarship may be applied at the undergraduate rate to tuition charges in the SIUE School of Dental Medicine, School of Pharmacy or Graduate School. One of the allotted 8 semesters may be applied toward costs associated with an SIUE approved study abroad program up to \$5,000.

The award will be credited to the student's university account each semester. By accepting this scholarship as part of your financial aid offer you agree to the terms and conditions of the award detailed herein. Financial aid offers can be accessed through your CougarNet account.

CODES in combination with other awards and financial aid

The CODES Scholarship will be applied to university charges for tuition on the student's account. CODES Scholarships will be considered awards to meet financial need in the packaging of financial aid. Should the crediting of the scholarship in combination with other financial aid result in excess funds on the student's account, the excess may be refunded to the student for other educational expenses. This award cannot be combined with any other institutional scholarship, but you will be able to apply any federal or state grants to the cost of attendance, and you may still apply for scholarships or awards outside of SIUE.

Academic Performance & Student Conduct

Continuance or renewal of the scholarship requires completion of full-time enrollment each semester (minimum 12 hours) and successful progress toward degree by maintaining a cumulative SIUE GPA of 2.5 or higher. You must also actively participate in the CODES program, including enrollment, participation in, and satisfactory completion of required CODES courses. Because CODES includes working alongside community partners with dedication and care, students must also adhere to the CODES Code of Conduct.

You must also abide by the University academic policy and the Student Code of Conduct as stated in the <u>Student Handbook</u> and the <u>Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy</u> for financial aid and scholarship recipients.
