EDWARDSVILLE, Ill.- Alcoholic Rehabilitation Communication Home, or ARCH, turned Cary Green's life around, and now he is repaying the favor.

Green began working at ARCH in April 2002 as a counselor and served as an interim director from 2005 until 2006. He was offered the director's position and accepted it in 2007.
