UCM was established in early 2000 with six church members. With technical assistance and training from the Gamaliel Foundation, we have grown to represent over 24 congregations with approximately 23,500 members.



Our member congregations represent the full range of communities in south western Illinois: older urban neighborhoods and new suburban areas;

white, African-American and Hispanic; wealthy and poor.

Our coalition is unique; we are faithbased, yet we transcend the often narrow range of people in individual congregations. We are multicultural, made up of many faiths, and inclusive of all ethnic groups and economic classes in the area.
