SIUE Facts

- For the second consecutive year, SIUE has been cited by its peers and reported in U.S. News as an “up and coming school.” The University is listed as one of 68 national universities and one of only three Midwestern regional universities for recently making “innovative changes in the areas of faculty, student life, campus life or facilities.”
- For the sixth consecutive year, SIUE is listed in the capstone experience category, among 15 universities - including Brown, Princeton and Stanford - for its comprehensive Senior Assignment program measuring the competency of graduating seniors.
- SIUE is among the top 20 public universities in the best Regional Universities Midwest (master's granting) category for the seventh consecutive year. The overall scores are based on the academic preparedness of students, graduation rates, faculty characteristics and the reputation of SIUE in higher education.
